

Nowadays, many houses have security systems. We can have our homes monitored, 24 hours a day, to make sure they are safe. The really advanced systems even allow us to tap into the cameras from our mobile phones.

We don't have to stay awake all night in case someone tries to burgle our home – the system takes care of everything. There are so many technologies available whose focus is to help us be prepared for all eventualities.

There are no such luxuries in the parables. The men who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding feast cannot afford to sleep. They won't receive an alert to their phone when their master arrives home. They have no option but to wait up.

In the short parable of the householder and the burglar, Jesus again emphasises the importance of 'standing ready.'



When our hearts are alert and open, we are more likely to see God's goodness in those we meet, and be ready to welcome his grace into our lives.

The opening verses of the Gospel reading invite us to ask ourselves what we see as our purpose in life. What are our priorities? Is our heart set on material progress and advance, or do we have other priorities? What has helped you to appreciate that there is more to your life than earthly possessions and success?

Maximillian Kolbe Feast day 14 August

St Maximilian Kolbe was born as Raymund Kolbe on 8 January 1894, in Poland. He was very active in promoting the Immaculate Virgin Mary being strongly influenced by a vision he had of the Virgin Mary when he was 12. Kolbe joined the Conventual Franciscans and was later ordained a priest. He founded a monthly periodical and operated a religious publishing press. He founded monasteries in both Japan and India; the monastery in Japan remains prominent in the Roman Catholic Church in Japan.

In 1936, Kolbe returned home to Poland, and after



the WWII invasion by
Germany began, he was one
of the few brothers to remain
in the monastery and opened
up a temporary hospital to aid
those in need. On 17 February
1941, the monastery was shut
down; Kolbe was arrested by
the German Gestapo and
taken to the Pawiak prison.

Three months later, he was transferred to Auschwitz. Never abandoning his priesthood, Kolbe was subjected to severe violence and harassment. When the Nazi guards selected 10 people to be starved to death in punishment, Kolbe volunteered to die in place of a stranger, a man with a family. It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners and remained calm. After two weeks, he was the last of the group to remain alive. After a lethal injection of carbolic acid he calmly awaited death. Recognised as the Servant of God, in 1982 Kolbe was canonised by Pope John Paul II who declared Kolbe a martyr. He is often depicted in a prison uniform. He is the patron saint of drug addicts, prisoners, families, and the pro-life movement; his feast day is celebrated on 14 August, the day he died.
