Invitation to CaFE's Bible Course - THE BIG PICTURE

Lockdown provides the ideal opportunity for us to take up this inspirational course which is a recommended resource for the Bishops' Conference Year of the Word initiative called 'The God Who Speaks'.

Course leader, Tim from CaFE comments, "We have discovered that this course allows God to speak to us through the scriptures to highlight a message for us individually. Some have found a new vocation or purpose; others have recognised a new or renewed significance in their life."

The journal-based course will be run for our parish with weekly Zoom meetings, and daily readings from your own journal. Many people in the parish have done the course before but that doesn't stop them registering and doing the course again. The course runs on Thursday evenings at 8pm over 12 sessions starting on 14 January 2021.

Brendan Day says of the experience, "The Big Picture helped piece together a lot of things that I sort of knew. I found it quite profound and deeply rewarding. It gave me a deeper understanding of The Word of God."

You Can Be Santa Scheme

The response from our parishioners for donations of vouchers to the 2020 'You can be Santa' scheme was tremendous and many also gave us cash donations as an alternative to vouchers.

We were able to provide £20 worth of vouchers to 165 children. Many of these are known to us from our parish schools, the SVP, the Life House and through individual parishioners. We also supported children from the St. Albans Refuge, families known to Home Start and the Intensive Family Support team. All the vouchers were delivered with a lovely Christmas card from the Parish which the children could colour in. In addition we gave vouchers to the single adults living in the Refuge and 13 adults with learning disabilities.

Our volunteer visitors did a great job, as usual, in ensuring that the vouchers were safely delivered to each family on our list or passed onto those organisations who distributed them on our behalf. As always, when we needed extra or last minute help with the scheme it was there for us. 2020 was a very difficult year for everyone and it has been uplifting to see that the generosity and thoughtfulness that always characterises the 'You can be Santa' scheme was not in any way diminished by the current crisis.

'Thank you for your ongoing kindness' said one mother. 'God richly bless you for everything you've done. I cannot thank you enough....' from another. The Intensive Family Support team told us, 'I just want to say a big thank you for the vouchers your parishioners generously donated. The families really appreciated them and the children were very excited about spending them.'

So a heartfelt thanks to everyone for all their support and to everyone who gave their time, commitment, and donations.

Sacrament of Reconciliation If you are in need of confession, please contact the Presbytery. Confessions will be held in the open air and observe social distancing.

Anointing of the Sick Current restrictions allow for end of life care, so those who are dangerously ill can be anointed at home or while in residential care (should the care or nursing home permit). Currently we are not allowed into Watford General Hospital (01923 244366) if somebody is admitted to hospital and wishes to be visited or anointed please contact the hospital chaplaincy. Where the person is incapacitated, the request must come from the next of kin.

Peace Sunday (17 January) This year Pope Francis asks us to think about 'A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace'. "How many resources," he says, "are spent on weaponry, especially nuclear weapons, that could be used for more significant priorities such as ensuring the safety of individuals, the promotion of peace and integral human development, the fight against poverty, and the provision of health care." Pope Francis calls on us to "strive daily, in concrete and practical ways, to form a community composed of brothers and sisters who accept and care for one another."

In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi. Their website suggests many ways we can all promote peace in our daily lives. There are activities for families to do at home, including a 15-minute [peace liturgy for young children](#).

St Sebastian - 20 January. St Sebastian joined the Roman Army in 283 AD and served in the Praetorian Guard, converting several prominent individuals to Christianity. This angered the Emperor who ordered him to be killed by having him used as target practice by archers. He was believed dead but was recovered by Irene of Rome, who nursed him back to health. Sebastian then criticised the emperor for his persecution of the Christians which led his being beaten to death. His body was secretly buried in the catacombs beneath Rome. According to historical records, he defended the city of Rome against the plague in 680. It is the symbolic association of arrows with the Black Death, during the Middle Ages and the Renaissance, which identifies Sebastian as the patron saint of plague victims.
