*Fr Michael writes ...* In today's second reading from the Book of James we are told that if good works do not accompany our faith, then our faith is dead. There is, in other words, a reciprocity or direct relationship between what we profess (our faith) and our actions (how we live that faith). Simply put you cannot be or claim to be a person of faith if that faith is not realised in concrete actions.

The Eucharist stands at the centre of our faith and at the centre of the Eucharist is our reception of Holy Communion. Faith believes that in receiving communion we receive the body of Christ. In receiving communion therefore, we unite ourselves to Christ, but more than this, in uniting ourselves to Christ we unite ourselves to the Church and to one another, for taken together we are the body of Christ, the body of Christ which has Christ for its head and which we become part of in baptism.

During mass the communion which we have, our being part of one body, is symbolised in a number of ways. It is manifested in our praying for one another, in the sign of peace which we exchange, and in our receiving Holy Communion in one unified action. Oftentimes the church in her liturgy addresses us brothers and sisters, for so indeed we are, brothers and sisters who are related in Christ.

Far from being a collection of random individuals we are a community. God has entrusted us to each other and has a part to play in this family. When we dare to receive the Lord in the communion. We not only Amen to him, 'yes Lord I believe it is you, that I am receiving', we are implicitly saying yes to one another. James reminds us that the communion we celebrate in the Eucharist, in the mass, is something that is to be lived out. If faith believes that we are brothers and sisters in Christ, if the sign of peace really is to be a sign of our communion, if the Eucharist we receive and the mass we celebrate is to live in our lives, then in our day to day lives we must live as brothers and sisters, we must take the time to get to know one another and to be a community.

In today's gospel Christ asks a simple question. Who do people say I am? As a community, as a parish, we could ask others the same question of ourselves. Who do people say we are? A body of relative strangers who know little of one another, or a communion of believers who celebrate in the Eucharist, in the mass, what they are in everyday life?

## SACRAMENTS AND LITURGY

**Mass Times - Sunday Evenings** Please note the new earlier time of 6pm for the Sunday evening Mass.

**Mass Times - Marshalswick Mass** We hope to resume the 9am Mass at Marshalswick/St John Fisher School from Sunday 26 September. Those attending are asked to wear a face mask, to sanitise their hands and to maintain social distancing. You may also be asked for your name and contact details. Some cleaning and sanitising will be necessary and stewards are needed to help. Please email the parish office if you are happy to help. The initial intention is to begin with reintroducing the Mass and once this is in place to re-introduce tea and coffee afterwards.

**Mass Times - Friday Mornings** From January 2022 the 10am Friday morning Mass will be discontinued. There will still be two public Masses parish every Friday. The Abbey Mass at noon and the 7pm in the Church. We will continue to have a 10am Mass on the First Friday of the month and where Funeral Masses require it.

**Sacraments of Baptism** The next baptism preparation course is to held on Saturday 30 October at 11.30 am. If your enquiry is more urgent please contact the parish office.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation** Confessions are currently available on Saturday mornings between 10.30am and 11.30am. You are also welcome to ring or call at the Presbytery door to arrange another time.

**First Holy Communion 2019/20** If your child received the Sacrament of First Holy Communion in July, August or October 2020 or July 2021 commemorative certificates will be presented at the 9.30am masses during October. Please email the parish office to let us know which of the October 9.30am masses you and your child will attend.

**First Holy Communion 2020/21** Parents and guardians of children currently preparing for their First Holy Communion in November should have received emails confirming the dates and times of their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Mass. If you have not had either email, please contact the parish office.

There will be a meeting for all parents and guardians in the church at 8pm on Wednesday 22 September.

**First Holy Communion 2021/22** Parents and guardians of children eligible to make their First Holy Communion in 2022 (Year 3 or above) will be invited to register their child online via the parish website between 1 November and 31 December. The programme will commence in January 2022.

**Confirmation 2019/20** Certificates will be presented to those who received the Sacrament of Confirmation in May 2021 at the Sunday evening masses at 6pm in October.

**Confirmation 2020/21** The entry for this year's delayed confirmation course for 2021 is now closed. The enrolment mass will be on 26 September at 6pm. If candidates were not baptised in the parish, please ensure that a copy of your baptismal certificate has been emailed to the parish office.
