Fr Michael writes...

As I write, there is still need for caution, in and around all our activities. We continue to wear masks in church, ask people to sanitise their hands on entering and leaving the church, and to maintain social distancing. Singing during Mass has made a limited return, but we have not yet returned to hymn books. In other words, we are trying to live sensibly with the corona virus. So, last weekend 'Little Lights' our Children's Liturgy for 0-5 year olds made a welcome return to the 9.30am Mass. It was marked by a palpable crescendo. A sign, a very welcome sign, of life! I never imagined I would write a front piece to the newsletter welcoming or rejoicing in the noise level at a Sunday Mass, but then I have never lived with or through the times we have gone through.

Looking forward to the time when we can gather more easily, when for example our sacramental programmes can make a full hearted return, I want to pick up the thread of our recent Parish Assembly; putting the various parish groups in place and reconvening our Parish Pastoral Council. I am sorry not to be further on with this.

Belong & Believe Central to the Parish Assembly were the themes of Welcome, Worship and Witness all of which, it seems to me, are key to our being vibrant community. From Monday of this coming week (Monday 23 January) there is an open invitation to all members of the parish to reflect on what makes for a vibrant parish community. Drawing on the most recent Café resource 'Belong & Believe' we will reflect on Celtic Christianity and the building up of the Christian community in these islands, asking ourselves what their experience says to us today and what we might usefully learn or appropriate for today. There will be three groups. A Monday morning group (10.45am) and a Monday evening group (7.45pm), both of which will meet in the Sacred Heart Parish Centre next to the church, and a Monday evening Zoom group also at 7.45pm. Update on Church Buildings Development One of the outcomes of this year's Parish Assembly was to consider opportunities to create a more welcoming and inclusive church frontage and porch, and to redevelop the presbytery to reflect the needs of our parish going forward. It would also seem an opportune time to reduce the carbon footprint of the church buildings. I would like to update you on progress with the project: Three diocesan-approved architects have provided very initial responses to the brief specifications and confirmed the need for a full site survey in order that more detailed designs and cost estimates can be prepared. Discussions have been held with diocesan-approved surveyors and we hope to issue a contract for the full site survey in the near future. It is estimated that the survey will take 4-6 weeks to complete.

It is likely that we will need to form a working party to review the detailed design options, and I am grateful to those of you who attended the Parish Assembly and have already expressed an interest in helping with this. I will continue to engage the parish throughout the process.

Journeying in Faith Finally, Covid conditions permitting we hope, in the not too distant future, to re-launch our Journeying in Faith for adults. This group, which is led by Deacon Steve and usually meets on a Thursday evening, may be for you, a friend or relative if they or you:

- Are curious about the Christian way of life
- Want to become a Christian e.g. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation
- Are the spouse / partner of a Catholic and would like to know more about joining the Catholic community
- Want to complete your Catholic initiation e.g. to be Confirmed in your faith
- Want to share and know more about your faith as a Catholic

LITURGY AND SACRAMENTS

Marion was a lifelong parishioner, being baptised, receiving first communion as well as being confirmed and married here at St Alban & St Stephen. Marion played an active part in so many aspects of parish life and was the parish secretary/administrator for seven years between 1986 - 1993. Her remains will be received into the church on Thursday 10 February at 4.30pm. As we commend her to God, praying for the repose of her soul, as well as for Geoff and the family at this time, we give thanks to God for the ways in which we as a community have been blessed by her friendship, faith and witness.

Mass Attendance As is our current practice, those attending services at St Alban and St Stephen and at St John Fisher, Marshalswick are asked to wear a face mask (unless medically exempt), to sanitise their hands on entering and leaving the building, to socially distance and to receive communion on the hand. Those who do not wish to receive on the hand should come up to Holy Communion last.

First Holy Communion 2022 All who have registered children on the course should have received an email link to last Friday's parent meeting. Initially the programme will run at home, with parents and guardians working through the early chapters with their child. The exception is the group of older children who will commence meetings in the Main Hall on Saturday 22 January at 4pm.

Confirmation 2022 We hope to commence the Confirmation classes for 2022 on Sunday 27 February and to continue them on a fortnightly basis. Further details will be emailed to those who have registered for Confirmation.
