## Lent - A time for moving towards God by Prayer, Word and Action

This coming Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Forty days of preparation for our celebration of Christ's crucifixion and resurrection. It is a short period when there are lots of opportunities for us to try to make God a bigger part of our lives.

On Ash Wednesday everyone is asked to abstain from meat (much easier these days with so many vegetarian options), while those over 18 and under 60 are also expected to fast from food, having one main meal and two light snacks. Abstinence and fasting are a way of bringing us back to God. As we deny ourselves we are invited to fill the space that denial creates with God. Ash Wednesday is traditionally marked by the imposition of ashes. Remember, says the liturgy, you are dust and unto dust you shall return. Remember that your being - your past, present and future - is always and everywhere in the hands of God, a God who has the power to create, to give life, out of nothing. Here at St Alban & St Stephen the ashes will be distributed at the morning and evening masses, 10am & 7pm.

Our Lent leaflet includes many suggestions as to what you might do during Lent to allow God to be a bigger part of your lives. One possibility is doing 'The Stations of the Cross' during which we recall the final hours of Jesus' life by visiting the 14 carvings or paintings depicting Christ's Passion that traditionally hang on the walls of Catholic churches. This devotion has its roots in the pilgrimages people began to make to Jerusalem. When such pilgrimage was no longer possible, people used works of art to bring both the story and sites of Christ's passion and death into their churches.

During Lent we will travel the Stations or Way of the Cross in church every Saturday morning at 9.30am. This will be followed by the 10am mass as normal. Each week will have a particular emphasis, with the Way of the Cross being travelled on Saturday 5 March having as its emphasis 'times of difficulty'. If you cannot make it to church, you can always join in this prayerful journey through our Lord's passion and death via stream by visiting our home page or YouTube channel at albanstephen.org. Alongside CAFOD's customary Lenten Family Fast Day on 13 March Lent offers two further opportunities for practical giving. One is to contribute non-perishable food goods to the Food Bank box in the Church Porch (which will be used to support the Salvation Army's outreach to local individuals and families), the other is to contribute to the Cardinal's Lenten Appeal. The appeal is used to support parishes and Caritas Westminster in their work with people in need and on the margins across the diocese of Westminster. Finally, there is still time to sign up to the weekly book club that we are running during Lent. We will be reading 'Let Us Dream' recently written by Pope Francis. The book addresses the impact of the Covid pandemic on society in terms of what we see, what we choose to do about it and how we might respond. Stations of the Cross On 5 March at 9.30am, the Stations of the Cross in times of difficulty will be celebrated in church; everyone is welcome to attend. This will be followed by Mass and exposition. **Gift Aid** If you have previously gift aided your standing order or envelope donations but no longer pay tax or are now unable to gift aid your contributions, please contact the parish office so that we can amend our records.

**Virgin Media Giving** VMG, the online donation platform used by the diocese, closed at the end of November. The diocese is currently setting up new online giving tools but the best way to support the parish is by standing order. A standing order form can be downloaded here.

Mass Intentions The best way to book mass intentions at the moment is to do so by phoning or emailing the parish office between 9am and 1pm any weekday. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed <a href="here">here</a>.

Please note that we are currently booking intentions for masses from May/June 2022 and that intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation is currently £10 per mass.

St David (520 - 589) - 1 March David became eminent as abbot and bishop at the site now known as St David's. He is credited with a monastic rule based on the example of the Eastern Fathers, and also with a Penitentiary. He presided at the synod of Llandewibrefi. Monks trained at his monastery evangelized South Wales and made foundations in Cornwall, Brittany and Ireland. St David is said to have sent a Mass rite to Ireland. At his death his contemporary St Kentigern witnessed in vision his entrance into the joy of his Lord. His holy relics that were found hidden in the fabric of St David's Cathedral are now carefully preserved therein. He was canonized by Pope Callistus II in 1123.
