The time of Lent ends, the joy of Easter awaits

Fr Michael writes... This Sunday, Palm Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week. For both Fr Andrew and myself this will be our first full Holy Week here at St Alban and St Stephen; Fr Andrew because he only arrived in January, myself because my first two Holy Weeks here were overshadowed by lockdowns of one sort or another.

Today we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and how, as we listen to the account of his passion, the crowd that had welcomed him with joy and the waving of palm branches, turned on him, and demanded his crucifixion. Then, beginning on Thursday, we will remember the events that stand at the heart of our Christian Catholic faith; the Last Supper where Jesus instituted the Eucharist and the ministerial priesthood (Maundy Thursday), Jesus' death on the Cross (Good Friday) and Jesus' Resurrection from the dead (Easter Sunday). Indeed, as St Paul reminds us in his first letter to the Corinthians, 'if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ is not risen. And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty."

These Holy Week celebrations or liturgies are among the most moving that we celebrate; the Washing of the Feet on Maundy Thursday, which reminds us that service - self-giving sacrifice - stands at the heart of the Eucharist, the Priesthood and the Christian life; the Veneration of the Cross, that instrument of torture, which Christ on Good Friday, transformed into the means of our salvation, and the Easter Fire and lighting of the Easter Candle at the Easter Vigil, a symbol of Christ's victory over the darkness of sin and death.

Many are accustomed to attending the Solemn Liturgy at 3pm on Good Friday, but as we celebrate these liturgies publicly for the first time in three years, please consider joining in the celebrations on Maundy Thursday (8pm) and Holy Saturday (8pm). Also, there is a special children's service at 11am on Good Friday, Stations of the Cross at 6.30pm, and an ecumenical Way of the Cross beginning at 7.20pm outside our church and concluding at the Abbey on Good Friday evening.

Unless you are medically exempt, we would ask you to continue wearing a face mask in church, especially at those services which are particularly well attended. Also, if you are feeling ill, even slightly ill, please join those participating from home via YouTube (visit our web page at albanstephen.org and click on the live stream button). Finally, please remember that Good Friday is a day of fasting (one main meal and two light snacks) and abstinence (no meat).

Offertory Promise Envelopes The new Offertory Promise Envelopes have now arrived. If you responded to the letter we sent out before Christmas or to the newsletter announcements confirming that you wanted to continue using Offertory Promise Envelopes, then these are now available and can be collected from the presbytery. We cannot leave them out on open display for people to collect as the labelling includes people's personal data. You can always ask one of the priests after Mass on Sunday.

Gift Aid If you are a UK tax payer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift (25p in every pound). If you do not pay tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement.

LITURGY AND SACRAMENTS

Stations of the Cross Good Friday At 11am all children and families are welcome to join in the Children's Way of the Cross. At 6.30pm everyone is invited to reflect upon our Lord's passion and death, In the midst of our busy lives, and in the present uncertain times, we will pause to pray as we reflect on Christ's suffering as it continues in the lives of his people. You can also view the Stations online and the text will be available to help you meditate. This service will be followed by a Cross Procession from the church to the Cathedral Abbey, finishing with the Unity at the Cross service led by Soul Survivor.

Holy Week and Easter Cards These cards now available in the church porch give the times of services for Holy Week and Easter. Let us respond to the Cardinal's encouragement to reach out to those who no longer attend Mass by taking a few and delivering them to neighbours and family.

Holy Week Posters These are available in the Porch. Please take one to put in a window and help spread the meaning of Holy Week.
