Fr Michael writes ...

This weekend sees the start of Holy Week, probably the busiest week in the Church's year. Our celebration of Holy Week will depend on numerous volunteers; welcomers, musicians, singers, servers, readers, eucharistic ministers, cleaners, linen washers, flower arrangers, fire lighters, booklet folders ... to name some, but not all. There are different ways in which so many help. On Saturday evening, following the 8pm Easter Vigil, we hope to celebrate with a small reception of drinks and nibbles, but we can only do it with the help of volunteers. If you are able to help please contact the parish office at stalbans@rcdow.org.uk by Wednesday of this week. Similarly, we need 12 people to volunteer for the Washing of the Feet on Maundy Thursday. Ignatian Prayer Between Easter and Pentecost we are fortunate to have Clare Bick, a member of the London Jesuit Centre Spirituality Team, leading a course on Ignatian prayer. In particular it draws on the use of imagination, inviting us to reflect on the scriptures by placing ourselves in them. Easter Offering The priests of the parish do not receive a wage or salary, instead they receive a monthly stipend or allowance which is funded out of the offering received on Easter Sunday and Christmas Day, as well as for masses, baptisms, weddings and funerals. If you wish to use an envelope for this purpose these are available in the porch.

Retiring collections during Holy Week The retiring collection on Maundy Thursday is being held to support the work of the SVP in helping local families with their energy and food costs. The retiring collection on Good Friday is a special collection for the Holy Places of Palestine. This offering, called for by successive Popes, allows our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land to continue to live, hope and offer a living witness to the Word made flesh in the very places and streets that saw his presence.

Easter Garden We are commemorating our deceased loved ones in a special way in our Easter Garden again this year by writing their names on bamboo flower shapes and planting these around the rose garden in front of the presbytery. They will be close to the three crosses and will be a symbol of the new life with Christ promised by the resurrection. If you would like to remember your deceased family or friends in this way, please send their names into the office clearly marked 'Easter Garden' either by emailing the parish office at stableans@rcdow.org.uk or by posting details through the presbytery door.

Gift Aid If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift (25p in every pound). If you do not pay tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named. The current tax year ends on 5 April 2023 and we will be submitting our gift aid claim for 2022/23 shortly after that.
