*Fr Michael writes...*

This weekend we keep the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or 'Corpus Christi' as it is often called. As Catholic Christians we believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. We believe what Christ tells us when he says 'This is my Body', 'This is my Blood', do this in remembrance of me. For the Jewish people the remembrance of things was so much more than the recall of past events; more than this, remembrance was the way in which things are brought to life. In other words when Jesus asks us to do this in remembrance of him, he is telling us that this is the way in which he will be alive and present among us. Of course Jesus is present in many ways. He is present in the Scriptures, in the Word, that is alive and active, which - as Scripture relates, cuts more finely than any two edged sword, and he is present when the Body of Christ - you and me, those who have received his Spirit in baptism - gather. Wherever two or three gather in my name he promised to be there. However it is in the Eucharist that he is supremely present, for it is in the Eucharist, where the bread that has become his body is broken, and the wine that has become his blood is poured, that the Cross - the whole of his life and mission - is made present to us sacramentally.

We acknowledge the presence of Christ in the Eucharist in a number of ways; by genuflecting - going down on one knee - every time we enter a church where the Eucharist is reserved in the tabernacle, in the way in which we dress the tabernacle, and in the constant light which burns on every sanctuary. It is also reflected in the way in which we are in church, moderating our voices, our actions, even our dress, conscious that we are in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, in the presence of Christ. And yes, it is acknowledged in our reverence at communion when we actually receive Jesus; in our predisposition (our minds and hearts), in our procession to the place of communion, on our knees, with a bow of our heads, with hands made into a throne. All these are signs of reverence, an acknowledgement, that this is a banquet of real food; food that enables us to be the Body of Christ in the world, because we have received the Body of Christ at the altar.

Their devotion to living in union with God's love, as revealed through the Sacred Heart of Jesus, is a shared vision with the Brothers of the Sacred Heart family across the world. Founded by Fr Andre Coindre in 1821, the community continue to minister in schools - including St Columba's College in St Albans - and in missions throughout the world.

**Mass Intentions** Mass intentions can be booked by phoning or visiting the parish office from 9am to 1pm any weekday. Outside of these times, please [email](#) the parish office to request a mass intention. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed [here](#). **Please note that masses can be booked up to a year in advance and the next masses available for booking are in November 2024** Intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation, which contributes to the stipends of the priests of our parish, is £10 per mass.

**Gift Aid** If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay UK tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift (25p in every pound). If you do not pay sufficient UK tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement from the parish. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named.
