Fr Michael writes... This year will be the 79th anniversary of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki on 6th and 9th August 1945 when somewhere between 129,000 and 226,000 people were killed. As in previous years, our Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation Group invite us to mark this tragic event and to pray for peace next Sunday at 2.45pm by joining with them for a short ecumenical service at the Peace Pillar in Sumpter Yard. All are welcome. This pillar or obelisk was presented to St Albans Abbey by the people of Japan in gratitude for Dean Thicknesse's condemnation of the bombings and his refusal to allow a service of thanksgiving and the celebratory ringing of the Cathedral's bells.

Mindful of all that is taking place in the Holy Land, the Ukraine and elsewhere in the world, our prayers for peace are as needed today as ever. Hiroshima and Nagasaki may seem a long time ago, and today's wars and conflicts may be hundreds and thousands of miles away, and we can all behave as if 'out of sight, out of mind' is a maxim to be lived by, but if anything the recent technological blip that disabled so many computer systems across the world is a reminder of just how interconnected the world is.

In the coming days you will see a series of origami cranes hanging from the consecration candles fixed to the church walls. These origami cranes have been produced for us by the students at Loreto College. The crane is a Japanese peace symbol and they have been hung around the church as reminder and invitation to pray for peace.

Summer break This is the last full edition of the bulletin until September. Mass Intentions Mass intentions can be booked by phoning or visiting the parish office from 9am to 1pm any weekday. Outside of these times, please [email](#) the parish office to request a mass intention. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed [here](#). **Please note that masses can be booked up to a year in advance and the next masses available for booking are in January 2025.** Intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation, which contributes to the stipends of the priests of our parish, is £10 per mass.

Gift Aid If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay UK tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift (25p in every pound). If you do not pay sufficient UK tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement from the parish. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named.
