*Fr Michael writes...* In recent local and now general elections our Parish Centre has been used as a polling station. On Thursday I watched for a little while as people came and went. Some went into the church by mistake. Hopefully, they will have lingered for a little. It struck me that we might have put up a poster giving people a choice 'Pray and Vote' or 'Vote and Pray', the implication being, that praying beforehand, would make a lot more sense. Of course, I doubt very much that such a poster would be allowed, but as I reflect on what was a mischievous thought, it strikes me that we should be doing both - praying before we vote and praying now for those who have been elected to government and public office. It is what Timothy calls us to in 1 Timothy 2: 1-4 and it is what we are invited to do Sunday by Sunday during the Prayer of the Faithful (also known as the Intercessions or Bidding Prayers) which are modelled on the Solemn Intercessions of Good Friday where we use the following prayer:

*Almighty ever-living God, in whose hand lies every human heart and the rights of peoples,  
look with favour, we pray, on those who govern with authority over us,  
that throughout the whole world, the prosperity of peoples, the assurance of peace,  
and freedom of religion may through your gift be made secure. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.*

## **PARISH ADMINISTRATION**

**Mass Intentions** Mass intentions can be booked by phoning or visiting the parish office from 9am to 1pm any weekday. Outside of these times, please [email](#) the parish office to request a mass intention. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by

making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed [here](#). **Please note that masses can be booked up to a year in advance and the next masses available for booking are in January 2025.** Intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation, which contributes to the stipends of the priests of our parish, is £10 per mass.

**Hiring the Parish Centre** Please email the parish office with booking requests or queries and visit the [Parish Centre Hire](#) page of our website for more details of hire charges and the range of facilities available.

**Gift Aid** If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay UK tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift (25p in every pound). If you do not pay sufficient UK tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement from the parish. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named.

**Contactless Donations** If you register as a gift aiding donor on one of our two contactless devices, please ensure you add both your first and surname, in full, and your full address, including road name, so that your gift aid declaration meets the standards for gift aid reclaim required by HMRC.
