# Fr John writes...

In today's Gospel reading from John, we hear Jesus's words spoken at the last supper before his death and Resurrection. John's Gospel unlike the other Gospels, does not include an institution of the Eucharist narrative; instead, Jesus washes his disciples' feet. Jesus announces that the Son of Man will be glorified in his death on the cross and in his Resurrection, and the disciples will glorify Jesus in the love they show.

John's Gospel does not present a sentimental view of love but a love that is shown in service and sacrifice. Jesus says: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another". Love is very important in the building up of the Church. In the Acts of the Apostles, it is clear that Christian love is the hallmark of Christianity. It was demonstrated to us through the witness of the martyrs and lives of the saints. We see it in the holy women and men who live and love daily, making small and large sacrifices for others, which we are called to do

Pope Leo's first words in his blessing to the world, centred on the importance of love. He said "God loves us, God loves you all, and evil will not prevail! All of us are in God's hands. So, let us move forward, without fear, together, hand in hand with God and with one another other".

The question we could ask ourselves today, is 'How can I live out this great commandment'? 'How can I love my neighbour as myself'? How often do I try to complicate things, when in fact all I need to be, is to be open to the other? The simple hello, offers an opportunity to begin a dialogue and every day we meet people in many different circumstances but without our openness to others, we cannot expect to grow in our understanding of love.

So, let us renew our commitment to love one another, in order to build a better community, one built on trust, friendship and love, so that everyone of us, as part of that rich tapestry of life, seeks to grow in love of the other.

Lord, you teach us that loving our neighbour goes beyond the boundaries of loving those nearest to us. Help us to see our neighbour in those who are far away, in the stranger, the marginalised, the disadvantaged, the poor and the vulnerable. Amen.

Gift Aid 2024/25 If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we cannot claim gift aid on your giving (25p in every pound). If you do not pay tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, HMRC may seek reimbursement. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory or building fund donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named. The 2024/25 tax year ended April 2025 and we will be submitting our gift aid claim for 2024/25 shortly.
