Fr Michael writes... In today's Gospel, we hear Christ's account of the dishonest manager who, when faced with the prospect of being sacked, decided to curry favour with those who were in his master's debt, by inviting them to falsify their accounts to their own advantage. On one level, Christ seems to praise the dishonest steward. 'The master', he says 'commended the dishonest manager for his shrewdness'. It would be a mistake however to assume that Christ is praising the manager for his deception; on the contrary, what he is praising, is not the manager's deception of his master, but the manager's ability to read the writing on the wall, and having read the writing on the wall, to use everything at his disposal to secure what he perceives to be his long term interests.

In all of this there is a straightforward question for each of us about the management of all God has given to us; with the gift of life, the world in which we live, the blessings we have received, and not least, the Word and revelation God has given to us in the person of his Son. Have we used these gifts to immerse ourselves in this world or have we used them for the knowing, glory and service of God? If our management, has been characterised by selfishness, then Christ in this Gospel issues us with the same wake-up call that the master issued to his manager at the beginning of the Gospel. Render me, he says, loudly and clearly, an account of your management. What have you done with the world I entrusted to you and with the free choice I bestowed on you?

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday 14 September Formerly known as Home Mission Sunday, Evangelii Gaudium Sunday is celebrated each year on the Third Sunday of September. The work of encounter and evangelisation is promoted through the Directorate for Mission. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed here. Please note that masses can be booked up to one year in advance and the first masses we now have free for booking are in January 2026. Please also be aware that weekday morning masses (excluding Mondays) will be held at St Barts for the duration of the building works. Intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation, which contributes to the stipends of the priests of our parish, is £10 per mass.
