Fr Michael writes...

Every parish is required by Canon Law to have finance committee to support and advise the parish priest in the administration of the parish finances and resources. At both St Alban & Stephen and St Bartholomew's we are blessed to have finance committees in place and I greatly value their input on how we use the resources gifted to the parishes by parishioners. In St Alban & St Stephen the finance Committee have been key to the realisation and development of the building works that are now in progress, while at St Bartholomew's they have been key advisers in terms of the presbytery refurbishment and its ongoing use.

Going forward I would like to increase the membership of both finance committees. If you have a background in finance and would be interested in finding out more and joining the finance committee please let me know. However we don't only need financial expertise. On one or both committees we would be grateful for some expertise in the area of data protection and property/health & safety issues. Again, if you have experience in this field please be in touch with me.

Finally, there is another area, also to do with parish finances, where we are looking for volunteers. Every other week in both parishes what we collect in the weekly offertory and in second or special collections needs to be counted. Being a counter would be a regular fortnightly or monthly commitment of approximately 2 hours each time. Again, if you would be interested in volunteering as a counter please let me know. The principal demand remains for long life items (milk and fruit juice), tinned items (fruit, veg, meat, fish and puddings), cooking sauces, coffee, teabags, cereals and jam.
