*Fr Michael writes...* In today's reading from Isaiah we're challenged to do away with the yoke, the burden that crushes others, to give relief to the oppressed and in so doing to be a light for others. Then says Isaiah, 'shall your light break forth like the dawn'. The call to be a light for others, for the world even, is taken up in the Gospel. 'In the same way', says Jesus, 'let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father'. Here Jesus elevates things to another level altogether. If you do good things for other, do them so that others may be drawn to God, to give him, not you, the praise. In other words do what you do without expectation of return. Do it unconditionally.

When God created the world, he rested, he didn't wait around for Adam and Eve to thank him. When the Prodigal Son returned to his Father, the Father didn't issue a list of expectations before getting the party under way. When the woman with a hemorrhage went to Jesus and touched the hem of his garment, Jesus could do nothing other than heal her. In all these situations there were no ifs or buts, no pre-conditions or maybes. Rather there was a generous and inevitable response which left the recipients utterly free, much as Adam was left free to turn away from the giver of the gifts that had been bestowed upon him.

So, the beggar will spend the money you have given him on things you would rather he didn't, the children will waste it on this or that, and people won't necessarily reflect your priorities in the spending of what you have given. It's tempting in these situations to be disappointed and to become cynical, so much so, that when the 'genuine' case comes along we find ourselves hardened and cold.

In all of this, I'm not saying give foolishly or blindly. What I am saying is that we should think carefully about what we do. That we should stop and reflect when the refusal to be generous with our help and in our judgements becomes ingrained and we find ourselves asking what's in it for me. Above all we need to remember what God has done freely and without reservation for us; that, when he created us he gave us the freedom to choose between right and wrong, and that even though we get it wrong, even though we misuse that gift, he doesn't withdraw it. On the contrary he invites us time and again issues to remodel ourselves in the image of the last Adam – the life giving-spirit who is Jesus Christ.

**Fire Marshals** This weekend there is an appeal for volunteer Fire Marshals as we need more in order to run a rota and be absolutely certain of our having the required number at each mass. Volunteer Fire Marshals will only be required to do something in the unlikely event of a fire. There are instructions and there will be training. Please think seriously and generously when listening to this weekend's appeal.

**Fire Safety** For the duration of the current works if the number of people in church exceeds 230 we will need to utilise the main hall as an overflow. Furthermore, following additional advice from the Fire Safety Advisor, we would ask anyone with impaired mobility, or who would need assistance to evacuate the building and who is unaccompanied, to make themselves known to the welcomers or the priest and to sit in the area and benches nearest to the confessionals.

## LITURGY AND SACRAMENTS

**PALM CROSSES** Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent will soon be with us. Please could you return your Palm Crosses from last year so that they can be burnt and the ashes used for Ash Wednesday.

**Way of the Cross during Lent** Every Saturday in Lent at 9.30am, before 10am Exposition, the Way of the Cross will be followed in Church with a different emphasis each week. You can also view the Stations online and the text will be available to help you reflect on this journey through our Lord's passion and death. **Coffee and Tea After Mass Refreshments** are available in the Parish Centre after 10am Sunday Mass during school term time, after 12 noon Mass on the first Sunday of the month and after 5pm Saturday evening Mass. Coffee and tea are also available after the 10am Mass each Monday. All are welcome so please do come along.

## PARISH ADMINISTRATION

**Mass Intentions** Mass intentions can be booked by phoning or visiting the parish office from 9am to 1pm any weekday. Outside these times, please email the office to request a mass intention. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed [here](#). **Please note that masses can be booked up to one year in advance and the first masses we now have free for booking are in May/June 2026. Please also be aware that weekday morning masses (excluding Mondays) will be held at St Barts for the duration of the building works.** Intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation, which contributes to the stipends of the priests of our parish, is £10 per mass.

**Prayers for the Sick** If you would like to include someone in the prayers for the sick, please contact the [parish office](#). Permission from the person being prayed for, or their next of kin, is needed. Names will normally be included for eight weeks, unless the request is renewed.

**Gift Aid** If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay UK tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift (25p in every pound). If you do not pay sufficient UK tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement from the parish. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named.
