We are a Fairtrade parish

Fr Michael writes... This coming Easter, across St Alban & St Stephen and St Bartholomew's sixteen adults will be baptised, received into the church, and/or confirmed. It will be the culmination of a journey which the group have walked together, accompanied by Fr John, Deacon Brendan and several more catechists and sponsors.

For each of the adults concerned, whether they are being baptised, received or confirmed, the sacraments to come will mark an important change in their lives, but just as things will be changed for them, they will be changed for us too. Every 'newcomer', whether it is through baptism, reception or by dint of moving home, changes and reshapes the community that we are. It calls us to be different and to do things differently. It's important to recognise and celebrate the presence of all who are new. Important for them, but also important for us. So as in previous years there will be a reception in the Hall after this year's Easter Vigil; to welcome, to congratulate, to be together in a more informal way. We need volunteers to assist with the refreshments. If you can help please email the parish office.

Car Park closure - Tuesday 24 March Please be aware that the car park will be out of use on Tuesday 24 March. The builders are redoing the carpark surface that day and have asked for the whole carpark to be cordoned off. There is some parking on the road (on single yellow lines) and at the station nearby, if needed. Apologies for the inconvenience.

Fire Safety During the current works, if the people in church exceed 230 we will need to utilise the hall as an overflow. Also, following advice from the Fire Safety Advisor, we would ask anyone who would need assistance to evacuate the building and who is unaccompanied to make themselves known to the welcomers or the priest, and to sit in the area and benches nearest to the confessionals. We are also asking for more volunteer Fire Marshals to ensure we have the required number at each mass. Volunteer Fire Marshals will only be required to do something in the unlikely event of a fire. There are instructions and there will be training. Please seriously consider volunteering. In addition to a fire marshal rota for weekend masses, we are putting together a separate fire marshal rota for Holy Week and Easter. **If you can help as a fire marshal at any of the following Holy Week services, please sign up using the sign-up sheets in the Parish Centre or contact the parish office: Good Friday 10.30am, 12 Noon and 5.30pm.**

Church capacity during Holy Week We are approaching Holy Week and the busiest week in the Church's calendar. The building works, have reduced the church capacity, so this Holy Week comes with the added challenge of managing the numbers of people in church. I am confident that we will be able to accommodate the numbers who will attend on Maundy Thursday and for the Vigil on Holy Saturday. The real challenge will be Good Friday and the Service at 3pm. This is usually full to capacity and draws in visitors and a number of people who do not regularly attend. These will not be aware of our current works or the appeal we made last weekend for people to consider attending the Stations of the Cross at 12 Noon and the additional service at 5.30pm. I do not want to ticket the 3pm Service on Good Friday but I would ask parishioners to consider attending the 12 Noon Stations and 5.30pm Service on Good Friday. During Holy Week, for each of the main services, we will establish an overflow upstairs in the main hall.

Music for the Triduum As with last Holy Week, the music this coming Holy Week will be a combined effort drawing on the musicians and singers from across the various music groups from the different Sunday Masses. There will be rehearsals at 6.30pm on Maundy Thursday (2 April), 12 Noon on Good Friday (3 April) beginning in the Hall, and 5pm on Holy Saturday (4 April).

Foot Washing If you would be willing to have your foot washed at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday evening please email the parish office. You would need to be present in church for 7.45pm on Thursday 2 April.

Instead, children are invited to sit on the carpet at the front of the church and the Mass itself is geared towards their participation. There is then a short social for everyone after mass.

PARISH ADMINISTRATION

Mass Intentions Mass intentions can be booked by phoning or visiting the parish office from 9am to 1pm any weekday. Outside these times, please email the office to request a mass intention. Donations can be made by posting an envelope through the presbytery door or by making a payment via bank transfer. Our bank account details can be accessed [here](#). **Please note that masses can be booked up to one year in advance and the first masses we now have free for booking are in July 2026. Please also be aware that weekday morning masses (excluding Mondays) will be held at St Bartholomew's for the duration of the building works.** Intentions may have to be moved with little notice to accommodate funerals. The suggested diocesan donation, which contributes to the stipends of the priests of our parish, is £10 per mass.

Prayers for the Sick If you would like to include someone in the prayers for the sick, please contact the [parish office](#). Permission from the person being prayed for, or their next of kin, is needed. Names will normally be included for eight weeks, unless the request is renewed.

Planned Giving Envelopes for 2026/27 These are now available to collect from the parish office.

Gift Aid for 2025-26 The current tax year ends on 5 April 2026 and we will be submitting the parish gift aid claim in the weeks following that date. If you are a UK taxpayer and have previously signed a gift aid declaration, but no longer pay UK tax, please contact the parish office and let us know. If you have stopped paying tax, we can no longer claim gift aid (25p for every pound donated). If you do not pay sufficient UK tax and gift aid is claimed on what you give, then HMRC may seek reimbursement from the parish. If you have signed a gift aid form, your offertory donations need to come from a bank account in your name only or a joint bank account on which you are also named. If you do pay tax and would like to gift aid donations you make to the parish, but have not completed a gift aid form, please contact the parish office.
